Key Objectives

- Work as part of the **Community Response team**.
- Deliver alcohol and liver health workshops to service users, providers, and the wider community.
- Provide one-on-one support, care planning, and information related to alcohol-related harm and liver health.
- Co-facilitate information-based and therapeutic workshops for service users.
- Conduct one-on-one assessments, key working, and care planning for service users.
- Liaise with relevant individuals, groups, communities, healthcare providers, and others involved in the service users' care.
- Always apply a client-centred, trauma-informed approach.
- Always act with the service user's needs in mind.
- Any other responsibilities, as directed by the Director or the Management Committee.

Day to Day Duties

1. Facilitate alcohol and psychoeducational/therapeutic groups/workshops for service users, both internally and occasionally externally.

2. Provide client-centred, trauma-informed support to service users, maintaining detailed records.

3. Collaborate in the design, delivery, and evaluation of workshops.

4. Respond to information requests via email, phone, and one-on-one, keeping accurate records.
